Loma Linda University Medical Center serves as the region's Level I trauma center.

Minimum Qualifications:

Knowledge of prehospital systems, clinical skills in emergency medical services, and 3 years of experience as a prehospital or hospital care provider. A bachelor of science in emergency services, health administration, public health, education, or health related fields, and eligibility for EMT-P, RN, or Physician Assistant licensure in the State of California are required; ACLS, PALS/PEPP, BTLIS/PHTLS, and BLS certification required.

Preferred Qualifications:

A master's degree or doctoral degree in emergency services, health administration, public health, education, or health related field; five or more years of clinical experience that includes the prehospital environment; and experience with teaching and education, adult learners, and medical simulation preferred.
