Kim Lew, EMSA: • Paramedic regulations will be open for review by OAL soon. Significant changes include the following: ☐ Training program approval by LEMSA where program/course located, instead of headquartered. ☐ TCC inclusion in program curriculum. ☐ Field Internship team lead requirement and high fidelity simulation allowed for part of ALS patient contacts **Motion: Approved** to separate TCC guidelines into two documents: Tactical First Aid/TEMS FRO and Tactical Life Saver/TEMS Technician. EMSA to develop a new Tactical First Aid/TEMS FRO document that includes clarification on instructor eligibility, application of training, approval process, etc., but no change to the CTEMS approved curriculum and send it to CTEMS members for review and feedback prior to the next CTEMS meeting. Motion: Approved curriculum proposed and provided to group of Ch. 3, Tactical First Aid/TEMS FRO, curriculum content **Motion: Denied** request for specific lifts, carries, drags to be included as an appendix due to concern over specific Guidelines: Chapter 3 educator/training contributions as a conflict of interest in a government document. There should be no reference to any particular provider. Motion: Approved to schedule special CTEMS meeting in Dec. or Jan. to finalize the Tactical First Aid/TEMS FRO document for submission to the EMS Commission meeting March 15th. Emphasis made to EMSA that Ch. 3, Tactical First Aid/TEMS FRO, is for Active Shooter/Terrorism, not TEMS/SWAT specific pre-planned events. POST/EMSA training program triangle diagram to be included in documents.

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Guidelines: Chapter 4 Guidelines: Chapter 4 (continued)	 Motion: Approved to have sub-committee review and revise the Tactical Life Saver/TEMS Technician course by removing some of the sub-bullets and propose instructor eligibility requirements for this course. Sub-committee advised to consider what the terminal competencies should be upon completion of the course. EMSA to ensure consistency of terms, such as "Learning Domain", "Law Enforcement", and "Casualty" vs. "patient" for both documents. Request instructor eligibility requirements noted, such as completion of the Tactical First Aid/TEMS FRO. Clarity noted that the Tactical Life Saver/TEMS Technician course is not to be attended in lieu of the POST Tactical Medicine courses. It is intended for first responders as an adjunct medical support response, not an assigned response as part of a SWAT team.
