<p><b>(1)</b> Valid EMT course completion record and proof of passing the NREMT exams all within two (2) years of application date</p> <p align="center"><b>OR</b></p> <p><b>(2)</b> Out-of-state initial EMT training course completion record and proof of passing the NREMT exams all within two (2) years of application date</p> <p align="center"><b>OR</b></p> <p><b>(3)</b> Current and valid out-of-state EMT certificate and proof of passing the NREMT exams within two (2) years of application date</p> <p align="center"><b>OR</b></p> <p><b>(4)</b> A current and valid National Registry EMT, AEMT or Paramedic registration certificate</p> <p align="center"><b>OR</b></p> <p><b>(5)</b> A current and valid out-of-state AEMT or Paramedic certificate</p> <p align="center"><b>OR</b></p> <p><b>(6)</b> A current and valid California AEMT or Paramedic certificate/license</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Other requirements for an initial CA EMT certification include: Application, fees, live scan – DOJ and FBI CORI received/reviewed, current NREMT registration/exam (unless possess current/valid in or out of state AEMT certificate or paramedic license).</p>	<p><b>Effective:</b> The day certificate is issued</p> <p><b>Expiration:</b> The last day of the month <u>two (2) years from the effective date of initial certification</u></p>	<p>08/16/2017</p> <p>08/31/2019</p>

**CA EMT CERTIFICATION RENEWAL §100080 (a)(1)-(6), (b)-(e)**

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A current CA EMT certification</li> <li>• Twenty-four (24) CE hours from an approved CE provider or 24 hour refresher course from an approved EMT training program (within the current certification cycle)</li> <li>• Completed application form</li> <li>• Completed skills competency form (EMSA-SCV (01/17))</li> <li>• Background check, if changing certifying entities</li> </ul>	<p>If the EMT renewal requirements are met <b>within six (6) months</b> prior to current certification expiration date:</p> <p><b>Effective:</b> The day after the expiration date of the current certificate.</p> <p><b>Expiration:</b> The certification will expire the last day of the month <u>two (2) years from the day prior to the effective date</u></p>	<p>Current exp.: 08/31/2017</p> <p>New eff.: 09/01/2017</p> <p>New exp.: 08/31/2019</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Note</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Starting 24 months after the effective date, 7/1/17, an EMT renewing certification for the first time shall submit documentation of successful completion of approved training in <b>naloxone, epinephrine and glucometer</b> that meets the standards in §100075. If in possession of a current California Paramedic license or AEMT certificate, then proof of training is not required.</li> <li>➤ A CA certified EMT who is a member of the <b>Armed Forces of the US</b>, and whose certification expires less than six (6) months from the date they return from active duty deployment with the Armed Forces of the US, shall have six (6) months from the date he/she returns to complete the requirements. The EMT must submit proof of membership in the Armed Forces in the US and documentation of their deployment start and end dates in order to qualify for this exception.</li> </ul>	<p>-----</p> <p><b>For greater than 6-month renewals, dates will auto populate in MLO to the same cycle; you will need to send a mlhelpdesk request with the subject "CORRECTION" so EMSA can revise the dates to be compliant with regulation. **REINSTATEMENT OF AN EXPIRED CALIFORNIA EMT CERTIFICATION §100081 (a)(b)(c)**

<p>For a lapse of less than six (6) months</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Twenty-four (24) CE hours from an approved CE provider or 24 hour refresher course from an approved EMT training program (within 24 months of application date)</li> <li>• Completed application form</li> <li>• Completed skills competency form</li> <li>• Background check, if changing certifying entities</li> </ul> <p>Lapse of greater than six (6) mo. but less than twelve (12) mo.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Thirty-six (36) CE hours from an approved CE provider or 24 hour refresher course from an approved EMT training program plus 12 hours of CE (within 24 months of application date)</li> <li>• Completed application form</li> <li>• Completed skills competency form</li> <li>• Background check, if changing certifying entities</li> </ul> <p>Lapse of twelve (12) months or more</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Forty-eight (48) CE hours from an approved CE provider or 24 hour refresher course from an approved EMT training program plus 24 hours of CE (within 24 months of application date)</li> <li>• Completed application form</li> <li>• Completed skills competency form</li> <li>• Background check required</li> <li>• Pass the NREMT exams within two (2) years of the application date (unless possess current and valid EMT, AEMT or paramedic NREMT certificate OR current and valid AEMT certificate or paramedic license)</li> </ul>	<p><b>(b) Effective:</b> The day certificate is issued</p> <p><b>Expiration:</b> The last day of the month <u>two (2) years from the effective date.</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Note</b></p> <p>Starting 24 months after the effective date, 7/1/17, an EMT renewing certification for the first time shall submit documentation of successful completion of approved training in <b>naloxone, epinephrine and glucometer</b> that meets the standards in §100075.
